



Distance Learning After School Programming

Extended Learning After School Programs will continue to provide student centered, quality care programs during out-of-school hours to prepare college and career ready graduates via distance learning. All after school programs will maintain a distance learning model until school sites are cleared for in-person instruction. The goal is to ensure that staff is maximizing student engagement during after school programming to support district instructional efforts. Opportunities will focus on supporting student learning and building positive relationships through student-to-student and student-to-staff connectivity.

Extended Learning will continue their partnerships with outside agencies to provide additional enrichment opportunities for students. For elementary and middle school sites, the City of Fresno will provide SPARK curriculum for physical education while California Teaching Fellows Foundation will provide homework support. For High Schools, academic and enrichment activities will be supported based on student interest and need.

After school programs will be staffed with qualified personnel to support students academically with online homework support, enrichment activities, and social emotional learning.



▶ After school programming will be offered virtually to students from 2:30pm – 5:30pm daily. Programs operate in accordance with the FUSD calendar and are closed on holidays and weekends with the exception of any special events.
